Parks Advisory Committee Advising in Action

Have you ever wondered how you can provide input on what happens at Tulare County Parks?

The Parks Advisory Committee (PAC) was established by the Board of Supervisors (BOS) in May of 2015 to provide a forum for citizen input on Parks matters, such as funding, improvements, and maintenance. The PAC studies issues, advises on subjects, and makes recommendations to the BOS. PAC members also assist in the promotion of Park resources, features, and events within the community.

The committee is made up of five members, that are appointed by each member of the BOS to represent their district:

Grand Re-Opening Celebration at Bartlett Park





On Friday March 28, 2025 we celebrated the much anticipated "Grand Re-opening" of Bartlett Park located in Porterville. This re-opening was long awaited as the Park was closed for over two years due to severe storm damage caused by flooding in early 2023.

The floods washed away arbors, the pond pier, cement pads, disc golf baskets, and electrical boxes. Staff began emergency repairs immediately with the support of local contractors and volunteers. **Improvements are as follows:**
